

2017 Volunteer Recognition Awards Criteria and Process

The CVI Volunteer Recognition Awards recognise and honour outstanding individuals who are making a significant contribution to Calisthenics across Victoria.

For the purpose of these awards, volunteering is defined as:

- To be of service to local, state and national Calisthenics and affiliated associations.
- Volunteer for either Victorian metropolitan and regional affiliated calisthenics Club/College.
- Volunteer for no financial payment.

SECTION 1: CRITERIA AND NOMINATIONS

There are four awards that aim to recognise people who volunteer for local clubs, regional and club competitions, CVI competitions and overall volunteer achievement. The four awards, and the criteria they are judged against, are:

Club Volunteer of the Year Award

The panel will consider:

- generosity of time, resources and energy
- making a difference to the local calisthenics community
- going 'above and beyond' the nature of the volunteer role
- inspires fun and enjoyment

CVI Volunteer of the year Award

The panel will consider:

- scope of work across the broad Calisthenic competitions local, district and state.
- volunteer impact at competitions, committees and club development.
- going 'above and beyond' the nature of the volunteer role

Service to Calisthenics Award

The panel will consider:

- scope of Volunteer work
- impact on the Calisthenic community
- time and effort committed
- other relevant information

Calisthenics Ambassador Award Sponsored by TryBooking

The panel will consider:

- minimum 3 years' experience as a participant or coach (mandatory)
- examples of performance and technical training
- leadership within Victorian Calisthenics
- examples of confidence, discipline, strength and teamwork outside of calisthenics, but attributable to calisthenics

SECTION 2: PROCESS FOR NOMINATION

Each affiliated Calisthenics Victoria Club is entitled to nominate 1 female and 1 male for the **Club Volunteer Award**.

Any member of Calisthenics Victoria, or affiliated organisations, is entitled to nominate 1 person for the **CVI Volunteer of the Year Award**.

Any member of Calisthenics Victoria, or affiliated organisations, is entitled to nominate 1 person for the **Service to Calisthenics Award**.

Please refer to the detailed information about the nomination process for the **Ambassador Award**.

For the purpose of these awards, an affiliated organisation is defined as:

- *CVI Committee members*
- *Victorian Calisthenic Coaches Association (VCCA)*
- *Australian Society of Calisthenic Adjudicators (ASCA) Victorian Branch*
- *Australian Calisthenic Federation (ACF)*

CONDITION OF NOMINATION

- All nominations must be on the official nomination form with a separate form for each nomination
- All nomination information and material submitted remains the property of Calisthenics Victoria
- It is essential that nomination forms are completed in full, including the name and contact details of both the nominee and the nominator

The nominator must sign the completed nomination form and have it seconded prior to lodging the application. Failure to do so will result in the nomination being deemed ineligible.

SECTION 3: KEY DATES, SELECTION PROCEDURE AND TERMS OF CONDITIONS

Key Dates

Applications Open: Wednesday 28 February 2017

Applications Close: Friday 31 March 2017, 5pm

Shortlisted Nominees notified: Monday 1 May 2017, by email

Selection Procedure

A panel comprising representatives from CVI and external partners will select up to four finalists in each category and selects the winning candidate. The winner in each category will be announced at the Celebrating Calisthenics Function, 18 June 2017.

The decision of the Volunteer Recognition Awards selection panel is final and no correspondence will be entered into. An unsuccessful nomination does not preclude the nomination being submitted in successive years.

Terms and conditions

- Nominee and Nominator cannot be the same person
- All information and photos provided may be used for promotional purposes in the lead up to, during and after the event in the promotion of the event or CVI as an organisation.
