

## CLUB SURFACE AND EQUIPMENT CLEANING GUIDELINES

The information in this guideline has been taken from the Victorian Government 'Coronavirus (COVID-19) cleaning guidelines for workplaces' guidelines and provided in accordance with the AIS Rebooting Sport Framework and is effective from **25<sup>th</sup> March 2021**.

COVID-19 spreads through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes. A person can acquire the virus by touching a surface or object that has droplets of the virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose or eyes.

### **Current requirements as of 25<sup>th</sup> March 2021:**

- **Frequently touched surfaces such as door handles should be disinfected between groups**
- **General venue cleaning should continue as per usual venue cleaning requirements**

Cleaning with detergent and water is enough for any non-healthcare workplace unless a COVID-19 case occurs. Once clean, surfaces can be disinfected. How often a surface should be disinfected will depend on the likelihood of contaminated material being present. This would include any time there has been a case or suspected case of COVID-19 at the club or a club with a high volume of participants who are likely to touch surfaces.

### **Definitions:**

The following terms are used in this document

- **Detergent** - means a surfactant that is designed to break up oil and grease with the use of water.
- **Disinfectant** - means a product labelled as household disinfectant, and containing  $\geq 70\%$  alcohol, quaternary ammonium compounds, chlorine bleach or oxygen bleach.
- **Frequently touched surface** - means a surface that is touched often, by the same or different people. For example, a door handle.
